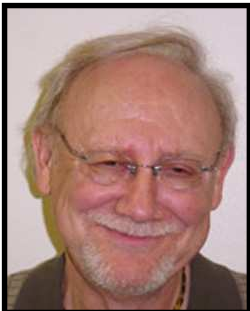
Jeff Robbins — Director

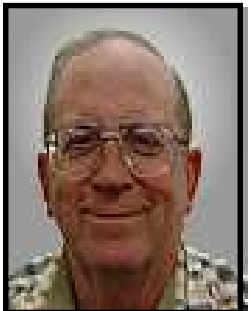
Dave Dockery — Director

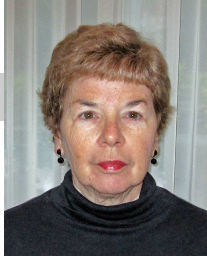

Overall, he is responsible for ensuring that flight hardware is available at all times to support Space Shuttle operations, and avoid zero balances that could delay a launch.
