 - Online private and public sharing, some tutorials; online photo management, editing and interactive photo galleries; browser-based upload and download, anywhere access to photos.

- Plus
 - Used in conjunction with Adobe Photoshop Elements 7.
 - \$49.99/year
 - Storage - 20 GB, additional storage for a fee.
 - You get creativity-inspiring ideas, tutorials, seasonal artwork, templates, movie themes, and special effects delivered regularly to your Adobe Photoshop Elements 7.
 - This includes syncing and backup from your desktop to the web and mobile access.

Photoshop.com Mobile

- Photoshop.com Mobile is simply the easiest way to upload, view, and share photos online from a mobile phone. It allows you to easily upload photos from the road to Photoshop.com, access them anywhere, and share them with friends and family. All you need is a supported mobile phone and a Photoshop.com account.
- Photoshop.com Mobile itself is free. All you need to do is download the application and install it on your phone. For information about data usage charges on your phone while using Photoshop.com Mobile to upload photos, please contact your wireless provider.

Photo File Formats and Sizes

- From a web browser, you can directly upload JPEG photo files up to 10 MB in size and up to 6000 pixels in height or width. – the most common format used in cameras.
- Takes about 45" to upload a 2.4 MB JPEG file
- Using an installed copy of Photoshop Elements 7 you can upload any or all of the file formats supported by those applications, including RAW, TIFF and PSD images and AVI video files.
- You can download copies of any files stored at [Photoshop.com](https://photoshop.com), regardless of format, using your web browser, Photoshop Elements 7, or Photoshop Elements .

Photo Size

- The basic online editor will only work on JPEG images up to about 2880x2880 pixels (about 8 megapixels).
- If the photo you upload with a web browser is larger, then it will be made smaller at [Photoshop.com](https://www.photoshop.com) when you edit it.
- Likewise, if you upload large raw, TIFF, or PSD photos from Photoshop Elements 7 or Premiere Elements 7, the online editor will first convert the photo to a smaller JPEG, and then edit that file.
- When you upload JPEGs, TIFFs, PSDs or RAW photos, the online editor only makes nondestructive changes to your photos.
- When you edit non-JPEG photos, the online editor creates a separate file copy in the JPEG format and that is the file that is edited. The originals are left intact.
